No your'e not—and neither am I. *Going off half-cocked, shooting from the hip*, without having done the research makes it such that you don't understand the *whole*. As with a fine watch, like a Rolex, it's not the *parts* that matter, it's their relationship to the *whole*.

Consider 3 things: globalists, nationalists, and patriots. As a senator who *stayed too long at the fair*, happy, cold-warrior Biden lacked the needed intellect to sort-out *parts* to *whole* relationships, which accounts for him becoming a stooge for WEF globalists. This defect allowed Biden to trade our republic for false ideologies and personal gain.

Then there's the nationalists. Xi and Putin to name 2. Each is patriotic to the nation they represent, and express unwillingness to *knuckle under* to interests of global controllers at the UN, or to the US hegemony. In that group we have Trump, a nationalist —but not a patriot. A US patriot needs to support the Constitution and the Bill of Rights.

Trump's nationalism is a step-up from Biden, but as a *law and order* guy, he supports *civil asset forfeiture* criminality, and not understanding 1st Amendment, decries protest.

This brings us to the tough part—the campus protests. Framing this, there are 2 sides, the *shut down these illegal protests now* side, and the *not so fast*, side. What we need to remember about protests these days is that each side of a protest is heavily influenced by entities not aligned with either side of the protest. They bring an agenda.

Like piles of bricks in the streets of Portland or Antifa/BLM being allowed to menace at will, there is more going on than the will of the people. And, as with January 6th, big money is at work, subverting any groundswell from the people—challenging its power.

You say you know what these protests on campus are about? No you don't, because it is unclear. But what we ought to know is that nobody at the top of the political totem is going to come and save us. Remembering Vietnam, when the protests began, the establishment *hard hats*, the *love it or leave it crowd*, were mobilized by an administration hopelessly caught in a quicksand of its own making, to attack any/all protestors.

So, what is going on with these protests? Is this a groundswell of young people tired of mass murder, or has it to do with political expediency? Whatever it is, is mostly protected by the 1st Amendment, and much of the violent response to protestors keeping students from classes, or using rhetoric/ideas that run contrary to the norm—is bullshit.

If laws are broken, arrests need to be made. But to come out in the main against protests is a denial of what is means to be an American. Our revolution against Britain

did not come from the top, it came from the bottom up—it came from American people.

If protesting is successfully stopped in the US, it's over. What is the underlying cause for the push to cancel the 1st Amendment? It's Israeli funding (gotten from US taxpayers), to prevent a rising-up in young people against genocide in Palestine, conducted by purported criminals, Biden/Bibi, with support from Trump, who waits in the wings.

Not understanding the parts to whole relationship makes for a Kristi Noem, Governor of South Dakota, who, though a hero during the lockdowns, cannot see the distinction between rabid Zionism and anti-semitism, causing her to conflate the 2, and possibly criminalize those who can make the distinction. And Kristi is not alone in her ignorance.

Pundits such as Jordan Peterson, JS Kunstler, Bobby, Jr, Trump and Jr., Mark Levin, and host of others blame Palestinian genocide on the Arabs—giving Israel immunity.

But it's not true. Beginning with Ben-Gurion sending out teams to find a homeland for Jewish holocaust survivors, that ruled-out Palestine as *there were people everywhere*. Yet Israel was the site chosen for a *Jewish State*. But the Arab population, within the boundaries of Israel, who numbered as many as Jews, were denied any voting rights.

Had Israel been formatted as a democracy, even in the midst of an Arab homeland, it might have worked. But when orthodox Zionists, over time, took control from secular Jews, forcing Palestinians into an *apartheid*, the stage was set for the present tragedy.

Franchising *settlers* (not settlers), to remove Palestinians from their land, by force, made a 2nd state solution, geographically impossible. This was the cause for unending strife, creating conditions for an inevitable genocide/mass murder—by necessity. What about about the Hamas atrocity, you say? That's a part, but only one part of the whole.

Disputants go back and forth about who did what—but these are the facts—covered over by endless propaganda and an Israeli lobby that has taken over the minds of Americans and the Congress. This is not about anti-semitism—that is a lie blown out of proportion by Israeli leadership. This is about power and control, and a deep fear on the part of Netanyahu that protests are a groundswell against his holocaust in Gaza.

It's not about the protests—as such. It's about reactive tyranny needing to remove the Bill of Rights—the 1st Amendment in particular. Americans, having lost their connection to the Constitution/Bill of Rights are blind to what is being foisted upon them.

There is no counterpart to Zionist propaganda for the Arabs. Consequently, with the Israel lobby pushing for complete suppression of the facts, most in the West have little idea that when Netanyahu likens US protestors to Nazis—he ought not throw stones.

Netanyahu says he controls the US and he does, to where he can insist that rhetoric, ideas, and TikTok, must be stopped at all cost. He needs to stop any *groundswell protests* against his murderous policies, and he is terrified because, unlike Vietnam, young Americans, without fear of being drafted, may have had enough of criminality.

Let me say it again: I don't know about the authenticity of these protests, but I do know that our only hope, as with Vietnam, is for the people to rise up against the elites.

What are our options for taking on the elite? They are 2. Bloodshed as a last possibility to defend the Constitution, or, the MLK Jr tactic when he crossed the Edmund Pettus Bridge in Selma on the *March to Montgomery*, where he was was greeted by Bull Connor and rabid racists with firehouses. He knew the only weapon available for non-violent protest was to fill jails to overcapacity—spreading alarm/crippling tyrants.
