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A Few Well-Placed Lies

A question being kicked-around is whether or not our destiny is controlled by a *hidden hand*. And if so, whose hand is it and to what extent does it control us? Europe/Britain are seemingly almost totally controlled and the last fight against liberty is being waged in the US.

But the degree of control is not what we might think. As with WEF/Clinton/Gates Foundations, persons behind hidden hands are not adept, rather they function through blunt-force trauma, with a few well-placed lies controlling minds across the West—especially in Britain/EU.

The biggest lie is there being a fix for our problems. Take Minnesota (especially Minneapolis) as example. Under the law (Constitution), everyone is deserving of *due process*, meaning each of 17 million illegals (including all those with a green card), are entitled to rule of law—an obvious absurdity.

Begin with the dollar backed with nothing but American exceptionalism, making spending limits unnecessary because in our ultimate wisdom we can print our way out of trouble. In terms of foreign policy, American exceptionalism allows for lies supporting regime change so as spread chaos globally in support of forever American exceptional tyrannical hegemony.

Other lies? There are more than 2 sexes, a lie used to dilute human reproduction, with a result that parents buy-into sex-change operations as the norm. And, mRNA makes 5 year vaccine-testing unnecessary. Instead we get instant miracle vaccines.

Was Trump chosen for the task of bringing down an archaic system that necessitated a Trump to destroy? Some of my closest friends think so—opting for a *hidden hand*, under direction of an established narrative. For any doubters of a *hidden hand*, you need only consider who it is, under the 1st Amendment we cannot criticize. In 39 US States, criticizing Israel is anti-Semitic and illegal under the law. And who is the main supporter for the cause of Zionism? By dollar necessity, it's Trump. The fix is in.

Trump accuses Canada as among those taking advantage of the US in terms of trade deficit. But is that the case? With US services added to the trade numbers there's not much of a trade deficit. Out of touch with reality, Trump is conducting trade war with our erstwhile ally.

Is it true that Canada needs the US and we don't need our largest global trading partner. What will happen to either—while Trump exacts his tribute?

Canada exports more to the US, \$413B, because its population is only 40 million, and it exports to 340 million Americans. The US exports \$350B to Canada, but, as I said, with US services added, trade deficit is negligible. Exacerbating whether the US needs Canada, the US gets 82% of all electricity imports from Canada—without which some northern states would face

tough winters. The US has natural gas but for our shortfalls, we import 98% from Canada. To round it off, 63% of US oil imports come from Canada.

Politically, 9 out of 10 Canadians do not want to become part of the US. Now, with Trudeau gone and Carney in, Carney is taking bold steps to preserve the power of *middle powers* such as Canada. But Carney is colored with an unenviable legacy as a central banker, as he attempts to change Canada's role of minion to the US. And, in his speech at Davos, he sadly aligned Canada with the *Coalition of the Willing*—to take-on Russia.

It's not clear whether Canada or the US can survive economically without the other. Even if new nations to trade with are discovered, it takes years to establish working supply chains. What about US oil refineries geared to process heavy Canadian tar sands—when Canada turns off the valve? Do we hire the Chinese to build new refineries over night?

What about Greenland? JD Vance, last week, removed any doubt that he is his own man with his utterance that Greenland will have to give up mineral wealth for US protection from China and Russia—neither of which expresses any interest in Greenland.
