I caught a 7 minute clip of Trump on late-nite from the 90's. He seemed more with it, compared to him now, going after a reporter about Spain. Didn't the reporter know about BRICS and Spain being in BRICS? Doesn't Trump that know Spain is in NATO?

That, put together with his assessment of Russian casualties/economy, makes me wonder if he's losing it. His take on Gaza (not off the cuff, but from note cards), sounds to be the ramblings of a sociopath—devoid of empathy for human suffering. Instead, he focuses on the devastation done to wonderful real estate, and a grand building project.

The other possibility, I'll call the Nixon/Reagan syndrome, where one appears unpredictable and a bit dangerous. To do this, imagine what Trump has to be capable of. He surrounds himself with neocons, knowing that his voice is the only one that matters.

Is Trump's plan a legacy of peace? Putin/Xi hold all the cards but Trump knows the art of the deal. Putin insists Ukraine can't ever join NATO, but for Trump a win is something like: 'Let's revisit it in 25 years.' Both Trump/Putin know NATO won't last 25 years.

Maybe Trump knows just where he wants to go—or maybe he's gone off center? I'm not going to sugarcoat this. If you're a Trumper, all the way, you might be like Germans during the 1930s when they shut-up/looked the other way as the tyranny unfolded in front of them and they did nothing. Will Trump, like Bibi be remembered as a tyrant?

In a grand vision Trump knows he cannot take over Gaza—a ploy to paralyze Bibi and get him out of power? A peaceful Trump knows he doesn't want to get into it with Iran—he instead wants peace in Ukraine/Palestine/Iran. Could that be Trump's plan?
