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Palestine Is Dead

Two weeks ago Israel was on the ropes. Even after its Gestapo *pager genocide*, Israel was losing in Southern Lebanon/initiating a cease fire they needed every bit as much as Hezbollah. Then came the *nice terrorists* overrunning Syria. Assad was not a plus for Syrians, but to have an ISIS founder (with a bounty), lauded as supporting all faiths is bullshit. The grey swan, Syria, is now a black swan—where it's neighbors, especially Turkey and Israel are gobbling up territory—which they have no intention of giving back. Everybody is in on it for their own interests and Hezbollah lost its main resupply route.

When Trump says there was no reason for Russia to be there—it's not the case. Syria was willing to stand up to the US for its sovereignty—the reason it ceased to exist.

Trump is of the opinion he can *tell* Putin what to do in Ukraine—nothing is further from the truth. And Trump (if he believes what he says), is as misinformed as to facts on the ground as is the Biden Administration. He posits that 700K Russians have been killed or wounded, compared to a few hundred thousand Ukrainian (troops/civilians).

This is a sad misrepresentation for anyone following the conflict. It is the Ukrainians that target civilians—not the Russians. And the kill ratio for soldiers is closer to 10/1 Ukrainians killed—to Russians. The problem I addressed in my last article—persons nominated, excepting Tulsi, to be national security advisors, are they a bunch of neo-con war-hawks, misrepresenting well-documented facts, either purposefully/ignorantly?

As we did in Iraq, Afghanistan, Libya, soon we will leave Syria, as we will leave Ukraine, starving wretches, viewed by US as a board game—fending for themselves.

Is Trump a wild card who might have a plan? As the days pass it seems less likely. Does un-inaugurated President Trump have a strategy towards Russia—for peace? Does he see that nuclear arms treaties are the single most important thing—needed?

With the fall of Syria with the hyenas ripping at the spoils, things don't look good. What will it take for US rules-based-order, true believers—to admit who we really are?

Trump needs disassociate from the *board game* that is US Foreign Policy, where opponents are neutralized without concern for justice. It's not enough for Trump to recognize there has been too much suffering/killing. He needs to recognize that decades of injustice have been done to Russia—and now is the time to admit to that—and fix it.

For President Trump, *the art of the deal* isn't winning—it's preservation of humanity.

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
