I was a little over the top with my last article: *Beware The Big Personalities*, calling-out Trump's nominees as fools/traitors. It wasn't a month ago I was advocating for Trump.

I voted for Trump. I stand behind that decision. 4 more years of the *left* would have sold-out the republic to the globalists. They had to be stopped, and Trump, drawing in Tulsi, Bobby, Elon gave me hope. But, as his nominees were announced, if you knew their stories, Trump, as in his 1st term—in large part, is still a bad judge of character.

My reaction to his nominees erupted because I expected he might be different this time. Maybe he will be, but, given some nominees for powerful positions—maybe not.

However it plays out, this is to be the most Zionist-abiding presidency in our history, and given the character of Netanyahu—a great danger to the existence of mankind.

So, what's in store for America, from both sides of the aisle, as applies to constitutional mandates? Start with Joe Biden's pardon of his son, Hunter. The Constitution on pardons: *The President shall have Power to grant... Pardons for Offenses against the United States...* Can there be a pardon for something for which someone is not criminally charged? Of course not. Biden's announcement of possible sweeping pardons betrays ignorance of the Constitution/or worse. Using pardons without charges, he could pardon anyone for anything. But, what about pardons intended to conceal crime?

Were a president to pardon someone for a political motive—would that rise to *treason*? Hunter Biden was charged with lesser crimes, but his pardon extends all the way way back to 2014, when Biden family Ukraine graft is alleged to have had begun. Is Hunter's pardon a sad attempt to circumvent the Constitution? Is it an act of treason?

Consider Hunter's laptop. Any of 50 intelligence officers who signed onto Hunter's laptop as Russian disinformation, knowing it was his, abetted constitutional treason.

Using his presidency to avoid Ukraine malfeasance charges—by extension exonerating *the Big Guy*, renders Biden a liar and a fool for going back on his pledge to not pardon his son. But, that leaves the unanswered question—is it constitutional treason?

That's the small fish. The big fish brings us back to the 1964 film, *Seven Days in May*, where the president, who is about to sign a nuclear disarmament treaty to end the cold war with the Soviets, becomes the object of a military industrial complex coup.

The film comes to mind because it was Trump who dumped the INF Treaty, and is responsible for our present situation wherein Russia has developed unstoppable in-

termediate missiles, for which the West has no answer. In response, President Blinkin (not a typo), pushes ever-closer to a nuclear film release—Seven Weeks in December.

What about Trump and the Constitution? This is Trump's last gasp at legacy, and his 1st duty is to the United States—not to Sheldon/Miriam Adelson. Throw them a bone and move on. No bullshit *memorandums of understanding* or Gulf of Tonkin resolutions replaces Congress having the only constitutional war-making powers: *US Constitution, Article 1, Section 8: The Congress shall have the power to declare war.* That's not Biden/Trump.

Why did the founders do that? To curb the power of the federal government. Instead it a vote of Congress—the people's will decides whether of not we will enter conflict. A standing army has constitutional limitations/Congress alone appropriates war funds.

This has all been turned on its head by tyrannical executives wresting control from Congress (and American citizens). HW Bush put 100s/1000s into the Gulf without a declaration of war. Who the did he think he was? Like his kid W.—he was the decider.

What the presidents do, one after another, is raise the risk of human extinction. With the bellicosity mouthed by some of Trump's appointees, I fear the worst. You can't put persons in power positions who advocate for color revolution/violent overthrow of democratically-elected governments the empire doesn't care for. Some of Trump's appointees have done just that, advocating to invade Iran after the murder of Soleimani. Not a murder? Were and are we at war with Iran? Are the Iranians terrorists? Are we?

Look at the facts, straight on. What's going on in the nation of Georgia is the West not accepting the will of the people to identify with Russian policies rather than join the EU.
