The World as Bryan Sees It - 3

Bryan's comments (not a degreed economist), but an economist I trust.

'Thanks Erik. This is an excellent summary of Trump's atrocities and America's decline. Although much longer than most of your letters, it is not long enough to describe the evils of the American Empire.

You mention that the metals are strangely underpriced. In fact, ALL commodities are underpriced and have been since America introduced futures pricing in the 1970's. Futures are designed to be manipulated and suppress valuations downward. This is done to create the illusion that the U.S. dollar is more valuable. In fact, since June 15, 1971, the U.S. Dollar has been an empty credit instrument. It's actually worthless.

Trump complains that Canada has cheated America by running a trade surplus. BUT WE ARE PAID IN WORTHLESS DOLLARS. The cheating is all by America. I doubt Trump understands this so add ignorance to his list of sins: liar, cheat, murderer, supporter of genocidal murder and war criminal. And the Epstein Papers are still unpublished. I can't think of a single American President who can claim a worse service record.'

'I use periods when gold.silver slip below the 200 dma as buying signals.

If we were looking at a chart that was pre 2010 MOST OF THE TIME GOLD AND SILVER PRICE CHARTS WERE BELOW THE 200 DMA EVEN THOUGH THE PRICE WAS IN A WEAK UPTREND.

You buy metal when the prices are below the 200 dma, and at the end of the month and during options expiration at the end of the month. When all three conditions coincide, it is usually safe to buy metal. This works unless we have a major intervention, like last Friday. That attack has pushed prices below the 200 dma for the first time in 2 years.

Understand that this was a Western banking cartel intervening in the PA-PER markets to crash SPOT prices.

Be aware that the mining shares have been under suppression for years. As paper credit instruments, they're easy to suppress by the same forces.'

'This is an AI production about the numbers not supporting Trump's, *We don't need Canada*, comment. The bilateral CUSMA talks between the U.S. and Mexico, in Mexico City have collapsed on the first day because the data inputs that Canada holds are missing. The U.S. wanted to re-weight the trade flows to generate more American production per vehicle but needed the Canadian data to calculate the re-weighting. Canada had not been invited to the table, and without this data an arbitrary re-weighting would violate the agreement. The first meeting lasted 40 minutes.'

'I decided to check on the paper oil price over the past ten years. Alasdair mentioned oil was hit in the paper derivative markets. The West still publishes the Brent crude and WTI oil derivative prices as if these prices were real. Oil is under \$100 while real oil is \$150 or more. On March of 2020 the

world oil price dropped precipitously. At one point at the bottom of the down spike people selling REAL OIL were forced by the 'market' to **PAY BUYERS \$40 PER BARREL TO TAKE AWAY THEIR OIL**. Yes, that's how ridiculous the paper pricing system is as the paper price of oil was dropped to **NEGATIVE \$40!** All paper prices are an illusion. This is the way the West cheats the rest of humanity which generally makes its living selling physical commodities at prices that Western banks fabricate with derivatives. The banks have no oil. Why is it that banks with no oil can sell paper IOUs for oil that they don't own and thereby rig **DOWN** the price of the real stuff? **AND THIS IS DONE IS VIRTUALLY EVERY COMMODITY**. This rigging reaches ludicrous peaks in oil, gold and silver, but the cheating permeates every commodity that has a futures or forward contract involved in its pricing.

You know, people complain about Trump and his cronies being crooks. In the West, being a crook is normal. It's ordinary people who are aberrant and naive. There is a saying: "People get the government they deserve." I now think this is absolutely true.'

'Gold dropped Almost \$200 in CAD on Friday as the banks crashed the paper gold market in London and New York. The Dow dropped 1% and the S&P dropped over 2%. Bitcoin dropped \$3000. All of this is paper and so is the drop in the gold price, so just ignore. Real gold or silver cannot be bought for the paper price and neither can oil. These derivative prices are a sham and the market is beginning to realize this, even here in the West. The fact is real oil, and real gold or silver just got scarcer, or as Alasdair mentions, silver consumers looking to buy silver at the new low price will find none for sale.'

'I noticed that 3:30-4:00 p.m. a rally by the plunge protection team years ago. In fact this stock market support mechanism was in action prior to 2006 as we approached the WFC.

Credit instruments are easily manipulated as they can be created at the stroke of a keyboard and sold just as fast. As Chris Powell of GATA said a decade ago, "There are no markets anymore, just manipulations."

The "plunge protection team", which includes the Federal Reserve can buy stocks with newly created currency from the Fed or related banks to support the credit system, including the stock markets. They do the exact opposite with commodities, including precious metals because the market for these assets is the antithesis of credit. So these assets are sold down in the derivative markets with paper instruments created out of thin air for that purpose. This heavy selling is rendered safe, because less than 1% of these artificially created debt instruments are ever called for delivery. The prices of ALL commodities are therefore illusions.

This is now ending because price suppression suppresses the supply of essential commodities, even food and energy, and precious metals.

Farmers stop farming, miners stop mining and fossil fuel resources remain undeveloped and un-drilled. The West has been in a depression since 2006. The depression has been hidden behind economic growth statistics like Gross National Product, which really monitor inflation growth, not real growth. Canada's slip into .1% negative growth is laughable. We have been encased in a shrinking economy for almost 20 years, and Canada is the best of the G7.'
