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There Is Only One Civilization

For Donald Trump, Russia is a diversion. His strategy is to control/break China using the same tactic used against Japan pre-WW2—cut-off access to oil. That's the principle reason for Trump's foray into Venezuela, for the proxy war against Russia, and ramped-up talk for boots on the ground in Iran. Each fashioned to conduct regime change. With scheduled visits to China, 2026, for a *big deal*, Trump needs to secure oil control now, not later.

China is Trump's overriding concern, but without taking global assets by threat, there is no apparent means to stop the US from becoming a 4th world nation. Trump's tactics in Venezuela are the same as for Iran/Canada/Greenland/Mexico. Use coercion to steal assets. Does Trump have an ethical limit? He does: *No blood for oil unless it lowers gas prices.*

Back in the States, we are watching '1984' play out—40 years on. By 1984, CIA cancer cells had entered every aspect of our body politic—in 2026 they infect every cell. Anticipating US strikes, the CIA set up in Iran, trucks and warehouses, to move on parliament and take over government. Regime change failed, but on they go—undeterred.

Trump threatens Nigeria (38 billion barrels), for not protecting Christians. Trump threatens Iran for cracking down on massive protests. Are there massive protests in Iran? After 43 years of crippling sanctions by the US,

there are few protests—except in the US media. By now, we should know, that Trump cares not for Christians/Iranians/Americans. One of the best podcasters, Nima Alkhorshid, *Dialogue Works*, a Brazilian/Iranian, lives in Iran. He sees no protests other than for reform—the rest sponsored by CIA.

Since the CIA began to consolidate power in 1947, the US Empire has been the *only civilization* allowed. Nations failing to accede to that truth are sanctioned out of existence. Fittingly, any nation advocating for control over its own future—is branded an enemy.

The Empire's playbook is nothing more than an elaborate rendering of a simple divide and conquer strategy wherein anyone refusing to recognize the *only civilization* finds itself in the crosshairs of US might/threat. Meanwhile, in a hopelessly divided US, we pit the likes of Trump against Biden/Obama—each incapable of real diplomacy with rising power adversaries.

What is the US strategy towards adversaries? *My way or the highway*, allowing no dissent/separation from US hegemony. Had Harris won the election, the Empire would have had to deal with the same consequence as Trump—utter defeat at the hands of Russia—who we portray as barbarians. In fact, any nation setting a course, distinct from so-called US democracy, is branded and dealt with as a sub-human people.

It's not just Putin that's sub-human. All Russians are sub-human, and, as such, every Russian is behind the thuggery in Ukraine. As retribution for barbarity, Russia needed to be broken up into regions, controlled by corporate—civilized American entities.

Why does the CIA/US go after socialist governments in the Americas with such vehemence? Socialists (in reaction to US hegemony), are hugely popular (winning elections by large margins). Their citizens, beleaguered/poor/starving under sanctions, see *cooperation* as a means to make their lives

better. Socialism for them, compared to the US horror—offers that.

But the US (itself a premier welfare state), in support of a disingenuous motif, promoting so-called democracy (actually crony capitalism), does the John Wayne thing, labeling *cooperative, socialist* nations with a broad brush, as *pinko-commies*. The US promises to make lives better, post regime change—with no intention to deliver on *better lives* promises.

Am I a socialist? Definitely not, though I recognize a need for government to function as an advocate for its people. Sadly, though not presented fairly, the Global South advocates for its citizens—while the US does not. And, in fact our view of nations (Russia/China), haven't been updated in decades.

If a socialist nation has oil, that's a wholly different thing. About those nations, we roll out lies without limits. Meanwhile in the dark recesses, CIA moves in with dollars/threats assuring no missile attacks on slow-moving US helicopters, to make possible a tactic of kidnapping an elected leader.

It's a sad state when a Taliban meme best describes US Foreign Policy: *You have all the watches—we have all the time*. Therein lies the question: Can the Global South remain intact until the Empire implodes? How this plays out will be the most significant answer to a question in human history.

Much of the world cowers in the face of Trump. So many examples: Brazil lacked the courage to vote to admit Venezuela into BRICS as a full member. Meanwhile US propaganda describes 20 super soldiers killing 100s in VEN, taking no casualties—to take Maduro. But is that true? Do the Russians/Chinese see GI's as super-heroes? Are we fed lies about unrest with Putin in Russia and mass protests in Tehran in support of a US tyranny?

Does it matter when enough Americans believe the lies? And our media, almost totally controlled before AI, now renders already brainwashed Americans unable to differentiate between what is real and not real. In Britain, free

speech is done, replaced a subsidized under 18 game—to quell questions.

Here, Trump supporters, (though under stress), still cling to notions such as: Trump is *shaking the tree/flexing a bit of muscle/one of all at the UN voting solely for their own interests*. Or: *if I want to know WHY Trump is doing what he's doing*, understand that Trump knows intuitively, that Gaza/Iran/UKR/VEN, taken together, define an interconnected Chinese, Russia ploy. How stupid does one have to be to buy into that crap?

The last thing Trump wants is a fair-playing field with access for all nations to trade. The Don-Ro doctrine is a complete subversion of the intent of the Monroe doctrine. Maduro offered access, and Don-Ro was not at all interested. Now, acting President Rodrigues, is threatened by Trump: if she doesn't do as she is told, she will be dealt a worse fate than Maduro. Her response to Trump's threats will likely determine world history.

Consider how bad the situation in Venezuela might become. With the Washington Post admitting the *Cartel of the Sun*, does not exist (a made-up CIA asset), from where will come factual basis for the kidnapping/prosecution of Maduro as a narco-terrorist?

Trump remains undeterred—in fact invigorated. He sees his reach as global.
