Why is it, when I critique Trump (after advising we vote for him), I am met mostly with silence from readers, or asked to go easy on him? The reason is seemingly apparent. When you critique Trump, you are criticizing Israel, Jewish monied interests, haters of Iran, haters of China, and disparaging a hope that Trump is going solve our problems.

Trump, viewed objectively, is Teddy Roosevelt with nuclear weapons. Trump's another huge personality, who sees the world as a chessboard on which to move *his* pieces around. When TR tired of his hand-picked replacement, Taft, he formed the *Bull Moose Party* (1916), splitting the vote, giving us Wilson—a huge factor in our demise.

Trump is going to do some good things—but he needs viewed with skepticism. I listened to his press conference today—in which there are warning signs. He can't rule-out military force in dealing with with Greenland/Panama. You find this attitude in TR, W. Wilson, Obama/Biden and Trump—but where is it in the US Constitution? Nowhere.

Most analysts speculate that Trump, talking about taking over Canada, Greenland, Panama Canal—as simply some kind of trolling. But, looking down at an Arctic-focused map of the world, the US is not to be found, but Russia, Canada, and Greenland are.

How does Panama play in? The Canal no longer belongs to the US, so, if we are unable to secure a northern shipping route, we may be out of luck. When Trump suggests we take back the Canal (possibly by force), maybe it's bluster. But, why would an American president say that? Surely he knows that's an act—outside the Constitution?

Why is Greenland suddenly of such vital economic importance for the US? How about, with abundant mineral resources and a tiny population, controlled by a weak Denmark, Greenland looks to be easy pickings for a bankrupt, rule-based-order US? What else? Russia has 100 icebreakers—some nuclear. We have 2—1 doesn't work.

Give Trump a chance? I am—but employing the old *trust—but verify*. Do I trust Trump? Some. But when I see nominee Tulsi supporting deep-state intelligence surveillance 702 and being asked to take back earlier criticism, I get the same question about her as I have about Trump: can she take that step and recover ethically—later?

Is Tulsi better than Clapper? Far better. Is Trump better than Biden/Obama? Do you even have to ask? Is Trump capable of doing stupid things and becoming a tyrant? You bet. Are Trump's people ill-informed? Just look at Musk referring to Ukraine as a 2 year stalemate. Millions have emigrated out of Ukraine, another million bled-out, and Russia

is grinding what is left into pulp. And, our incoming administration sees it as stalemate?

Is that bluster, also? Let me tell you what is not bluster. The election in Romania being overturned because the EU doesn't like who won. And the same fate for AfD in Germany if they win—or allowed to participate. Western tyrants ain't letting control go.

Consider Trump through eyes of the world, especially the Global South. They already know decades of abuse at the hands of the US, and they don't want to see Trump (Make America Great Again), at their expense. They already see though the travesty of rules-based-order—the last thing they need from Trump is to perpetuate it.

What I get from colleagues is mostly a wait-and-see on Trump. But he is out there now and we should bring skepticism to what is being said. Trump is way preferable to the left. By force of personality, he may have some success bringing peace to Ukraine. And, he (possibly) okayed something from Jeffery Sachs—highly critical of Netanyahu.

Trump's been left with a debt of \$36T—but no worries, he will begin knocking that down real fast. Bet me. Trump, in his 1st term, outspent Biden. His attempt to continue *rules-based-order dominance* (not possible), will require massive military spending.

Trump guarantees that had he been president, Ukraine would not have happened. Trump armed Ukraine. What about all those CIA stations and bio-labs? They were there in 2016. What about 14K Russian speakers killed in Donbas, by Ukrainians, since the illegal coup, 2014? Ukraine is broken promises made by serial presidencies.
