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*Trump Shows-Off His Deep State Colors*

The globalists didn't destroy this nation by themselves. Both parties get the credit, voting to waste hard-earned tax dollars, unconcerned about piling debt on citizens, to fund US global adventurist hegemony, which is now beamed-in a desperate attempt to take down China/Russia/Iran while we think we still are able.

Switzerland came in 2nd. Need I say where EU/Israel/US were ranked?

Is there need for a new global deliberative body. Or is the problem that the UN Charter (like the 250 year Constitution), celebrating its 80th anniversary, founded on the supremacy of international law, and right to self-determination—is simply being ignored?

To my friend I say: Let's be real. The US does nothing to promote democracy—we are a tyranny with no democratic affiliation. Yet we refer to nations who resist our hegemony as terrorist states. But are they? Yemen, which we've bombed for a decade, is not an Iranian proxy. Yemenis make huge personal sacrifices to support Palestine.

Is Iran a terrorist state? If resisting US/Israeli genocide is terrorism, then yes. But if Israel/US are nothing but ongoing war crimes, seeking to inflict turmoil—regime change where they are not wanted, Iran/Yemen, under international law—are heroic nations.

What about Palestine? October 7th was the consequence, not the cause, of decades of Israeli murder of Palestinians. Israel, as an occupier, has a UN duty to protect Palestinians—an occupied people. Under UN Charter, Palestinians have a right to attack its occupiers. Oct. 7th dead was minuscule compared to Palestinians murdered by IDF over 50 years of illegal occupation. How many Americans know this—or even care?

What's going on in Gaza is addressed in 3 pillars of international law, embraced in the UN Charter: 1st pillar—each nation has to solve its own internal dilemmas. 2nd pillar—the international community has a duty to assist in solving those dilemmas. 3rd pillar lays-out international community obligation to confront and solve ongoing problems.

America needs a geo-economic history lesson. The US is 4% of the world's population. Russia, China, India are half of a world—no longer willing to let US injustice slide.

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
