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Trump's Dilemma

It's less than 2 weeks until Trump is inaugurated, for his promise to America, on that day, to end the war in Ukraine. We won't hold him to his promise, but he left America with an expectation he would be able to bring peace to Ukraine. However, serious obstacles stand between Trump and any peace deal amongst Ukraine/NATO and Russia.

One obstacle has to do with perception. US networks, showing the battlefield in Ukraine, present us with an unreality. In the 1st months of the invasion, Russia made a gambit that didn't work out. To the untrained eye, the withdrawal from Kiev makes it appear that Ukraine has gained more territory than it lost. With a promise to take conscription down to age 18 from 25 (if nations harboring young UKRs send them back)—Ukraine vows to fight on.

To any not following the facts, it seems a betrayal to not continue to arm/fund Ukraine—after all the blood they shed for us. Another \$100 billion and Ukraine wins.

But they do not. Given facts on the ground, Ukraine does not win under any circumstances. Young Ukrainians, conscripted and untrained, are but cannon fodder for Russian artillery/missile strikes. Over time, another million Ukrainians to be killed/wounded.

Battle statistics, supported by misrepresented dead/wounded, make it appear Russia is on the losing end of this thing. But nothing is further from the truth. The only hope for Ukraine to be saved is for NATO (actually the US), to come into the conflict on the side of Ukraine. It's possible this could happen over the next 2 weeks. Though unheard of for an outgoing president to embroil us in *end of term war*—this *left* knows no bounds.
