When Entitlement Becomes Fear

I was going to title this article—*When Greed Becomes Fear*, but most people I know aren't greedy. Greed, for the most part, resides at the top. My neighbors are entitled.

How to express my thoughts without appearing the curmudgeon? Because I sleep in a car/tent on trips, my neighbors who spend sumptuously in support of their lifestyles, see me as an anomaly, not quite right—someone off-center. Someone to be tolerated?

They try to be helpful, suggesting I make a list of everything my wife ever wanted and make her dreams come true. Like a vacation to Paris (a drive through France), among other things. I smile my best good neighbor smile—without making comment.

Europe, with millions of unvetted refugees, looks to me a dangerous destination, not unlike Portland/Baltimore. My neighbors know nothing of the stabbings, rapes, violent robberies. They don't know that 70% of all violent crime in Paris is committed by immigrants—and France is dealing with it by cutting the funding for reporting crime, by half.
