With a red maple leaf tattooed on my forearm, I'm Canadian, born in Montreal, lived there until I was 5, when my family moved to Toronto—then to the US and SoCal in 1956. As a little kid, what mattered

was the Montreal Canadians, blue/white/red (bleu/blanc/rouge), jerseys. And then the blue/white Leafs.

After we moved to LA (hockey wasn't broadcast), I still played, but I lost touch. But I now had to choose—to root for a team. It wasn't difficult for me—I'm an American, and in sports I root for the USA. But if somebody other than the USA has to win, I become a Canadian—*the maple leaf forever*.

About the politics. This morning I read: Jack Hughes, the New Jersey Devils star whose winning goal made him the face of Team USA hockey ignited a sense of pride in being American. Instead, the left-leaning outlet HuffPost wrote, 'If waving the American flag or chanting 'USA!' turns you off right now, you're not alone.' You gotta be kidding?

Each of us needs a sense of shame to hold us back from being the idiot we can be. Apparently the HP lacks that. I read about Trump inviting the team to the State of the Union/Oval Office, and I think they should go. There young Jack Hughes, in Trump's presence, has an opportunity of a lifetime to ask the president why, along with supporting sports, doesn't he support the checks/balances in the Constitution/Bill of Rights?

It's a lot to ask of a young hero, but if only... And while he's at it, Jack can thank Trump for giving women's sports back to women, and suggest he think about removing the ban on Russian athletes at future Olympics, since Russia is not responsible for millions of lives lost in Ukraine. Instead, it's the US/NATO—and that blame extends to Trump.

There's much talk of being 'proud to be an American'. Am I proud? Definitely not. Am I proud of our nation on the global stage? No way. Have we become a godless nation?

Whether you be Christian or follow another world religion, as long as you don't identify with an insane Mike Huckabee, rationalizing scripture to slaughter millions, attachment to God benefits mankind. And, it doesn't have to be within the confines of religion, *divine principles* render a similar outcome, concern for humanity—a necessity for justice.

With recognition that each human being has a soul, and each soul is created equal, justice and empathy become possible. Slaughtering millions, especially among browns/blacks, is off the table. Plans to reduce human population by nefarious means is not an option. But, with God having died in the West—genocide is becoming the norm.

Only look at Rubio speaking in support of colonization and its legacy—slavery and servitude. For colonizers there needs to be subhumans—not recognized by God. Instead, we get ungodly lawlessness and an elite ruling class—sitting-in for God.

Along with the Federalist Papers, were the anti-Federalist Papers, arguing for control by an elite class—a cause deeply ingrained in the human psyche—requiring a vastness of sub-humanity.

If it sounds simplistic—it is. Identification with elites renders one incapable of sovereignty. And a cap with letters: TMWT—Tell Me What to Think. Democracy doesn't work. It morphs over time into anarchy. By default, it ends in tyranny. The only system of government that works is a republic governed by checks and balances, making it difficult for elites to take power from citizens—but necessitating citizens act to preserve their liberty.

Is Donald J. Trump a good man? No. Is Trump a God-fearing man? Likely not, but looming midterms might soon cause him to act as if he is—before the Ides of March.
